

to do it and it came out when the appropriation bills were brought to the floor. It was late in the session and I believe that it is of utmost importance to the State of Nebraska and to agriculture, itself, that we get all of the use out of the grain if we go into the alcohol program. It is another plus as far as I am concerned to get the top costs off of the gasohol product. I would urge this body to consider this seriously in bringing this bill back for this specific amendment and I so move, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion is return of LR 965 for the Cal Carsten amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The bill is returned. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: I move for the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion is to adopt the Cal Carsten amendment to LR 965. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Carsten's amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Carsten amendment is adopted. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: I move the bill be advanced to E & R.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion to advance LR 965 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor signify by saying aye, I didn't hear anybody, aye, opposed nay. The bill is advanced to E & R for engrossment. Does that complete all the amendments, Mr. Clerk, on 965? We now go to LR 928, Senator Burrows.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Burrows moves to return LB 828 to Select File for a specific amendment. Read Burrows amendment found on page 2059 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Mr. President, members of the body, this amendment would strike the language that allows the Game Warden to pick up any equipment and hold it until after the trial. I think one thing wasn't mentioned before. It gives the Game Warden a tremendous upper hand. It has a penalty clause in the bill later on where you go to the court and enforce the misdemeanor penalty clause but in taking a vehicle, a tractor, a pickup, a four wheel drive pickup, and depriving the person of that until after the trial, you incur probably charges of \$100 or two before the person is convicted. Now who is going to pay for the tow away or the tow in, if it is ever used? If it is not going to be used, it should not be in the law and who is going to pay if the man is found innocent?
