

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The bill, LB 910, is advanced. I would like to take the opportunity to introduce on behalf of Senator Dworak 23 fourth and fifth graders from Immanuel Lutheran Elementary School in Columbus, one teacher, five parents, Mary Lauritzen, teacher. They are in the North balcony. Would they stand up and be recognized, from Columbus. They have already gone. They are in the North balcony, over here. Okay, the South balcony, we have got some in the South balcony, too. We have from Senator Bereuter's District, 60 seniors, two teachers from York High School. Lawrence Felk, Social Studies teacher. They are in the South balcony. Would they stand to be recognized. Welcome. The next bill is LB 713. Senator Simon.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Simon moves to return LB 713 to Select File for a specific amendment, that amendment being to adopt the Simon amendment on page 174<sup>2</sup> of the Journal.

SENATOR SIMON: Mr. President, members of the body, we did debate LB 713 last Friday rather extensively, about three and a half hours. Many of the amendments which were not adopted failed, not because they did not receive more than the majority of the votes. In this particular case, this amendment had 24 votes and there was about 10 negative votes and some abstentions. There was about ten or fourteen, fifteen people that were not absent. I think this particular amendment, as has been said before, is probably the most reasonable amendment that was offered. What this amendment would do is that if a person is arrested but not charged or convicted of a crime, that those records would not be made available....

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: A point of order, Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: State your point.

SENATOR MURPHY: Once again we are dealing with reconsideration out of time. The bill has been hashed over. I think we need a little discipline on this floor if we are going to finish anything before midnight, that the issue was discussed, it was debated, and as I say, it is not an amendment. It is a reconsideration and out of time.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, we are going to check on the time to make sure, Senator Murphy, but I think you stated the dates. It has to occur the next, either the same day or the next day.

SENATOR MURPHY: And may I say, Mr. Chairman, that he was not on the prevailing side.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: That makes three reasons.

SENATOR SIMON: Mr. President, Senator Barnett has said that he would be happy to introduce this amendment, if Senator Murphy wanted to challenge....

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: That is if it is in time. We just checked the time. It is not within time so it is out of time and you cannot make the motion. Senator Koch.
