LB 713, 386

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, a similar thing happened earlier this morning on 828. Senator Burrows returned the bill to strike the amendment he tried to strike two weeks ago and we allowed that to happen.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I sat here and I didn't hear any objection.

SENATOR KOCH: Well, I am objecting now. It may be ex post facto but...

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We have had intervening business. There is nothing you can do about it now. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: The Call.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. Motion to raise the Call. The Call is raised. Senator Simon, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR SIMON: I have a question of the Chair. Would it be in order then for Senator Barnett to offer that motion?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: It wouldn't do any good because it is out of time. You will have to change the amendment, bring it in differently, if you want to. That is up to you or up to Senator Barnett. If you will bring in another amendment, not that amendment, because the point of order is well taken and you cannot make...that is a reconsideration and it is out of time.

SENATOR SIMON: Okay.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, if you go ahead and look it over and bring in whatever amendment you want to, we will look at it. We will go ahead then to the next bill which is LB 386. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, whatever, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the catering amendment the Liquor Commission requested that we put on the bill yesterday, somewhere along the line somebody forgot to put half of the words in. These are the other half of the words.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. I take it that Senator Koch and Senator Barnett's lights were on on the last bill and not on this one. Right, Senator Koch? We will then vote on the return of LB 386 for the DeCamp amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The question is the return of LB 386. Have you all voted? Have you all voted. Senator DeCamp, do you want to put the House under Call again?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Oh, give it another minute or two. I hate to bug everybody.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Would those of you who are going to vote, would you vote. It would be nice if we didn't have to go under Call. If you would just vote. You are there. I see you. Either vote...or vote red, if you don't want to vote for it, vote red but vote. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

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
