

SENATOR MAXEY: Mr. President, I ask to move LB 867 back for a specific amendment and this is a friendly amendment. What it actually does, it gives the State Racing Commission, when the State Commission gives a town the permission to race on Sunday, I believe everyone should have a right to vote on this. What we need to do is have 10% of the number of people voting in the last preceding general state or city election to put a referendum on the ballot and this is the way it would sound. The question shall be placed on the ballot in this way, Shall the conducting of horse racing on Sunday be prohibited in the city or village, one, racing on Sunday or against racing on Sunday? Now, right now we only have five days that they can race. Now if they need a sixth day they can race on Monday but gives the people a way of petitioning and opting out of racing on Sunday. So I ask that you would move LB 867 back for this specific amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Dworak, do you have a question?

SENATOR DWORAK: There is no debate.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: No debate, but you can ask a question.

SENATOR DWORAK: Senator Maxey, is this the amendment that we agreed on?

SENATOR MAXEY: Yes, it is.

SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you, Senator Maxey.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The question is the motion to return LB 867. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Maxey, do you wish to have a Call of the House.

SENATOR MAXEY: Yes.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Make the record. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 3 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The House is under Call. All Legislators will return to their desks. And the Sergeant at Arms will bring in all members who are not at their desks. All non-legislators will leave the floor. The Legislators will register their presence. The House is under Call. Senator Brennan, are you here? Senator Keyes. Senator Fowler, Senator Schmit, do you want to press your button and show you are here. Senator Moylan. Senator Maxey, do you wish a roll call vote? You want to take votes?

SENATOR MAXEY: Yes.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We will take votes at this time. Senator Duis voting aye. Senator George voting no. Senator Labeledz voting aye. Senator Merz voting aye. Any others wishing to vote? Senator Kelly voting aye. Has everybody voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.
