SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Chambers, did you have a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Maxey, now this would relate to the entire day of Sunday not just to a certain segment of Sunday, like the morning hour?

SENATOR MAXEY: No. It starts at 1 o'clock. Senator George put an amendment on to have horse racing not to start until after 1 o'clock on Sunday.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then this would mean that there could be no horse racing after 1 o'clock even...?

SENATOR MAXEY: Before one o'clock Sunday morning.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that is the church hour, and so really the issue might be one of choose you this day whom you will serve but I will tell you how to get around the churches. Let them declare the winnings to be earnings and give the church its usual 10% cut which they call tithes and I think everybody will be in favor of racing everyday.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Was that a question? Was that a question, Senator Chambers? Senator Keyes, are you satisfied with your question. The question then is.....Senator Simon. Senator Simon, you were the one who didn't want to go into the noon hour.

SENATOR SIMON: I just had a question. I wanted to know if she would accept an amendment to have it (interruption).

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Do you have a question?

SENATOR SIMON: Yes, Senator Maxey, would you accept an amendment to have it be 1 o'clock on Saturday also so we can be consistent?

SENATOR MAXEY: If you would put it up, I would support it.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right, the question then is the adoption of the Maxey amendment to LB 867. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Maxey amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Maxey amendment is adopted. Senator Maxey.

SENATOR MAXEY: I would like to readvance LB 867.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion to readvance to E & R for enrrossment LB 867. All those in favor signify by saying aye, opposed nay. LB 867 is readvanced. We now will go back and pick up Senator Richard Lewis' LB 814. There are two amendments on that, I believe, Mr. Clerk, one from Senator Lewis and one from Senator
