SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator, let's read the amendment in first.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Richard Lewis moves to return LB 814 to Select File for specific amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is to combine into 814 a bill that was brought to the Public Health Committee by the Department of Health which provides, and that bill number, incidentally, was 794, and we are, because the subject matter is similar, we are incorporating this into 814 and it provides definitions for who may handle radioactive materials and how it may be handled and it brings the state into conformance with federal regulations. And as I understand, if we do not bring by statute the state into conformance, then the Department of Health will be operating under the federal regulations which I do not feel is good. I would ask you to return this bill for this specific amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator George, do you have a question? Senator George, do you have a question? Senator Maresh, do you have a question? Yes, Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, a question of Senator Lewis.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR MARESH: Does this pertain to the same section of the law that we've questioned previously?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes.

SENATOR MARESH: It does. Same section, same article in the statute?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: If I understand your question, you mean is it compatible with 814?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes, it is, sir.

SENATOR MARESH: Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Okay, the question then is the return of LB 814 for the Senator R. Lewis amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Let's vote because E & P is never going to get these bills back for engrossment if we don't get out of here before noon on these bills. So I plead with you to get voting. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes. 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 814 is returned. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, I would move adoption of
