PRESIDENT: LB 907 passes. Please read on Final Reading LB 966.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read LB 966 on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 966 pass with the emergency clause attached? Record your vote. Have you voted? Make the record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Record vote read. (See pages 2142 and 2143, Legislative Journal.) The vote is 47 ayes, 0 nays and 2 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 966 passes with the emergency clause attached. While we have been on Final Reading many groups have come and gone including some 8th graders from District 45 in Raeville, Nebraska. That is Senator DeCamp's District. And some 7th and 8th graders from Boone County rural schools, both in Senator Dworak's and Senator DeCamp's Districts. And we had 8 postsecondary teachers, University of Nebraska School of Technical Agriculture from Curtis, Nebraska. That is in Senator Dick Lewis' District and we have in the South balcony now 53 seniors from York High School and that is Senator Bereuter's District. We thank all of you for being with us today. We also have in the North balcony just coming in now 70 11th and 12th graders from Tri-County at Dewitt, Nebraska. That is Senator Burrows' District. We thank all you students for being with us, too. Do you have some things to read in, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a communication from the Governor. Read communication found on page 2143, Legislative Journal. Mr. President, Senator Frank Lewis offers an explanation of vote. Mr. President, new resolutions, LR 305, read. LR 306, read. Finally, Mr. President, LR 307, read. (See pages 2143 - 2145, Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports we have carefully examined LB 153 and find the same correctly enrolled; 375 correctly enrolled; 424 correctly enrolled; 448 correctly enrolled, 464 correctly enrolled, 554 correctly enrolled; 562 correctly enrolled; 576 correctly enrolled; 578 correctly enrolled; 632 correctly enrolled; 649 correctly enrolled; 692 correctly enrolled; 695 correctly enrolled. Signed Senator Cullan, Chairman. Mr. President, Senator Chambers asks that LB 711 become law, notwithstanding the objections of the Governor and I understand he wants to lay that over.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LB 153, LB 375, 424, 448, 464, 554, 562, 576, 578, 632, 649, 692, 695. The Chair recognizes the Speaker.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, just to note that I have conferred with Senator Warner and Senator Warner wants to take up these gubernatorial vetoes and that would include anyone else that wants to take up vetoes this afternoon. We decided that it would be best to do this right after lunch so that everybody is aware when it is going to come, when the attempts will be made and reports on the state of the income and outgo and the fiscal ramifications of any of these actions and
