

the Governor's recommendation?

SENATOR WARNER: I said, Senator Mills, the total appropriations are over the Governor's recommended appropriations but we are under, at this point, available revenue.

SENATOR MILLS: Okay, I know that is what you told me but the question was, how much are we over the Governor's recommendation?

SENATOR WARNER: How much? It is on the back of your green sheet.

SENATOR MILLS: It is on the back of the green sheet. Would that be that...

SENATOR WARNER: This one here.

SENATOR MILLS: 562.

SENATOR WARNER: These will not be exactly right now because included in our total, the \$569 million, includes some bills that have been enacted, sent to the Governor and which he I don't know if he has either signed or vetoed. This is as of yesterday evening. He, at that time, was at \$562.7 million. We were at \$569.2 million.

SENATOR MILLS: Then the answer to what I am trying to get to is somewhere around \$7 million?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, but what you must also subtract from that, because you can't make that raw comparison, the Governor has never made, as he indicated in his budget message, a recommendation for expenditure of the Omaha medium-minimum facility. We have what, 3.5, oh, a total of \$5 million included in this figure for that facility. And his recommendation for that facility has never been made so the real comparison you have got is a \$2 million difference because I don't know what his position is on that. He has never indicated it.

SENATOR MILLS: Now, one more question, Senator. In your motion for LB 953, we have come around a long way. Is your motion to override these items that have the double asterisk in one vote or are you going to split the issue?

SENATOR WARNER: The motion, as it is written, Senator Mills, as I indicated the other day, those items that the committee unanimously agreed to recommend for overriding are in a single motion but there is no problem at all if any member wishes to ask for a division of the question. It can be done at each and every one.

SENATOR MILLS: Thank you. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think finally the entire picture is unfolding as to what is occurring and has occurred, and I would like to lay it out as I see it. We were told we would have a number of dollars by the Board of Equalization and by the Governor to pay for the needs of the state. Relying upon
