PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Senator Cope, is this where they're putting the Safety Center, the Driving Center out there at that...?

SENATOR COPE: If the Safety Center is approved that will be the location, yes, sir.

SENATOR DWORAK: In addition to those funds, we need this additional \$150,000?

SENATOR COPE: No, this is not for that. They are finishing up rooms for the nursing program. There are several other projects.

SENATOR DWORAK: Is this the same location?

SENATOR COPE: It's the same location, yes, using state property without building additional buildings and utilizing them.

SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you, Senator Cope.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall that portion of LB 956 contained in paragraph one of Senator Warner's motion become law notwithstanding the Governor's objection. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you voted? Record. Senator Cope.

SENATOR COPE: I'd call a roll call, Call of the House and roll call please.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, shall this House go under Call. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: Record your presence, please. We're under Call. Record your presence. Senator Reutzel. Senator Dworak, would you record your presence? Senator DeCamp. Senator Newell. Senator Keyes and Schmit, we are under Call. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 2166 of the Journal.) 26 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator John Savage moves that the Call be raised. Seeing no objection it is so ordered. Under the south balcony we ought to welcome back a great friend of ours. Everybody knows him and wishes him well on his recovery, our good friend, Dr. Mike Paradise. Mike, would you stand and be recognized? It's hard to tell when you're standing and when you're sitting, Mike. Senator Luedtke.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Then I think it might be a good thing to remind ourselves of what we've got left to do. We have this afternoon Final Reading after this of two hours, after this and you'd better take the resolutions today because you have coming up on the sixtieth day, nine hours at least of Final Reading and if you're going to have any overrides you are going to be here until midnight.
