CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined Legislative Bill 786 and find the same correctly enrolled, 786 A correctly enrolled, 803 correctly enrolled, 803 A correctly enrolled, 808 correctly enrolled.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LR 786, 786 A, 803, 803 A, 808. Bob. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, I move that the rules relating to resolutions be suspended and the list I have there be adopted all at once. The list is all noncontroversial, the kind that say we love motherhood and all that kind of stuff. We pulled all the others off. Read the list there.

CLERK: LR 203, do you want me to read the resolution? Oh, just numbers? 203, 210, 211, 215, 216, 219, 223, 231, 297, 302, and 303.

PRESIDENT: Well the main thing to understand is that 152 is not on here. Are you ready to vote on the question of suspending the rules to have one vote on all of this? Are you ready to vote? Senator Frank Lewis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: We don't know what 303 is.

PRESIDENT: I don't either.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: All right. Forget it. Just vote on it then.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator DeCamp--229 is an extension of the Oversight Committee which is not put into the interim study. I wouldn't think that would be a controversial one. I don't know why he didn't put that one on.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Put that one on. I agree. I got the list from Roland and I agree that is noncontroversial. It's something that has to be done so add the number 229, is that right? And 237 I understand is noncontroversial and 229. Is there any other one? Is there any controversy on the labor contract one, anybody? I'm just trying to get all the ones that have no difficulty or controversy to them. What's 301? Well, hell, throw it in. Oh, heck, I mean. Do you got all those numbers then?

PRESIDENT: The numbers the Chair has is 303, 310, 311, 315, 16, 19, 23, 29, 31, 37, 97, 02 and 03.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Okay, I want 229 on there. That's another one that has to be done. There's no disagreement on that.

PRESIDENT: It's on there. I read that.

SENATOR DE CAMP: 229?

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Okay. And 301 and 307. Jack Mills retirement. Commending Jack Mills for retiring.
