SENATOR COPE: How many are not in their seats?

PRESIDENT: Two.

SENATOR COPE: I would like to have a roll call please.

PRESIDENT: Call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 30 ayes, 15 nays, 2 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting. Vote appears on page 2264 of the Legislative Journal. Mr. President, Senator Cope now moves that 693 A becomes law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 15 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting. Mr. President, Senator Loran Schmit moves that LB 943 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

PRESIDENT: You heard the motion. Record your vote. Have you voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 8 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 9 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 861. 867.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read LB 867.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 867 pass? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 31 ayes, 12 nays, 6 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 867 passes. Read LB 870.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read LB 870.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 870 pass? Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 43 ayes, no nays, 6 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 870 passes. Read on Final Reading LB 871.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read LB 871.
