

SENATOR SAVAGE: I was on the...I didn't vote on the bill and I'm eligible.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All right. The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, is the...am I in error that the ability to discuss...is that still in effect or was that only during the time that we were breaking into final reading?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Well, actually the Speaker only intended it to be for those bills that we were discussing at that time so I don't think technically unless the body wants to make that apply now why, you can go ahead, fine.

SENATOR WARNER: Thank you Mr. President. May I only say this, that I can appreciate that there are those of you who philosophically are opposed to what is provided for in LB 861 but again this has been indicated time and time again. Those of you who are philosophically opposed and live in other parts of the state are doing nothing to change that issue as the provisions of 891 pertain only to Lincoln, 861, excuse me, pertain only to Lincoln and Lancaster County and brings them into conformance with the rest of the state, and if there is a will to have these provisions of five acres statewide, it will obviously take the introduction of legislation to bring about that change at some future session of the Legislature. The other item I want to address, some members have indicated they were annoyed by an article that appeared some time in the paper. Some comments from one of the City Council members here in Lincoln and I would hope that some of those ill-advised remarks made by one of the council members that could be applied to the body as a whole would be ignored and that you would vote the necessary 30 votes for the bill to be reconsidered.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: I guess the question has been called for so I won't say anything.

PRESIDENT: The question then is shall we reconsider our previous action on final reading on LB 961. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you voted? This is a reconsideration vote. Have you all voted? Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I heard you say 961, this is 861. The bill that only affects Lancaster County.

PRESIDENT: It's 861. Have you all voted? Make the record. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I will have to ask for a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Call the roll.

SENATOR WARNER: Maybe I better ask for a call of the house first. Some of the members may have left thinking final reading is completed.
