PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, did you wish to comment on Senator Kelly's amendment? All right. Senator Marvel, do you want to speak?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, I've got to check and see what.... 187 and 188 were referred to the Judiciary Committee on the request of the introducer of both Resolutions and if my memory doesn't do tricks with me, this is Senator Marsh and Senator Marsh may have a comment as to what Senator Kelly talks about, as to why 187 and 188 should be referred to Judiciary rather than Public Health and Welfare. Your motion is Public Health and Welfare, right? Okay. I will yield to Senator Marsh.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I requested this placement of the bills because they are relating to statutes which are of the particular concerns relating to the laws effecting these two particular areas. I feel that this would be the logical place for them to be. I would certainly welcome Senator Kelly serving on the committee as well, since he has an interest in this area. Senator Kelly. I would certainly welcome you on this committee and I want to make that publicly known, to serve on the committee and I also want to serve on the committee with the Judiciary Committee and I would encourage you to do so and I would welcome you and I want it publicly stated.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I understand that Senator Marsh would like these referred to Judiciary, but having served on both the Judiciary Committee and Public Health and Welfare, I feel that they should be sent to Public Health and Welfare to preserve the integrity of the committee system by topic, by subject matter, and I think that Senator Marsh's request is out of order and I certainly agree with Senator Kelly.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dick Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, I would only echo what Senator Cullan just stated. I feel perhaps the integrity of the committee is questioned here. We have in the past had issues concerning day care center, in fact we introduced legislation in this area. I think that we can be completely objective and fair and I...while we don't need any additional business, I feel that perhaps this committee based on their experience in the past are more than able and qualified to hear these particular resolutions.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly, would you close on your amendment please.
