CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on Senator Stoney's amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Senator Koch, do you want to renew your motion to adopt the resolution?

SENATOR KOCH: So moved, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there a second to the motion? It has been moved and seconded that LR 2 be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Voting on LR 2 introduced by Senator Koch. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the resolution is adopted. We now go to page 97, LR 3, and the Chair recognizes Senator Carsten. Senator Newell, would you mind turning your light out please?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I move for the adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Second? Okay. The Chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The presentation of this resolution is an action of the Oversight Committee and as you recall, during our last session and the controversy that was coming up all over the state on equalization and the extreme differences in re-evaluations was causing a lot of problems. The resolution was presented to the Legislature to create to this committee which was made up of chairmen of all Standing Committees with myself as chairman over all for the purpose of examining and making recommendations for the correction of these inequities. We did function during the last year. We also are aware that we have not finished our job and that it will be a continuing process for some time. In light of those circumstances the committee voted to submit to this body the resolution to continue this which needs to be done by this body as opposed to the last legislative session. That is the reason for this resolution and I would urge that you support this move, Mr. President.
