LB 7

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Senator Nichol, are you prepared with LB 7?

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay.

CLERK: Read title to LB 7. The bill was first read on January 4th. It was referred directly to General File.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL. Mr. Chairman, I move for the advancement of LB 7.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there a second to the motion? The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I want to make this clear. This is really a Clerk's bill and it has to do with the price of the unbound session laws and the daily Journals as set forth in the bill. This was handled by the old Executive Board and rather than having us each year have a bill which stated a stipulated amounts for these two items, it was decided that we would have the Executive Board each year, set the price so that it would be commensurate with the cost of these two items.

SENATOR MARSH PRESIDING

SENATOR NICHOL: Madam Chairman, do I say Madam Chairperson?

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: I move for the advancement of LB 7 to E & R Initial.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. Is there further discussion? Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Madam President, inasmuch as this is not a revisor's bill, I think the Legislature could permit its introduction by suspending the rules, permitting it to be brought to the floor directly and possibly preclude any argument about our abuse of our own handling of revisor's bill. If this is agreeable to the Chair, I would amend Senator Nichol's motion and ask that the rules of the Legislature be suspended and the introduction of the bill be permitted without a public hearing.
