SENATOR MARSH: 327 in the Journal.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Any further discussion? All those in favor then of adopting the...

SENATOR MARSH: That is not the page, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 327 and 328, Senator?

SENATOR MARSH: Okay, 328, yes, thank you.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Page 327 and 328. Any further discussion? All those in favor of adopting the reports vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay on the adoption of the Committee on Committees report, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Motion carries and that committee report is adopted. That will conclude then the reports of the Committee on Committees. We will proceed then with agenda item #9 on motions. We will start with Senator Newell's motion on withdrawal of LB 163. The Chair recognizes Senator Newell.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell's motion may be found on page 332 of the Journal.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, the withdrawal motion of 163 is made by the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee which all members have signed. The basic problem and the need for withdrawing this bill is that 163, when it was introduced, was poorly drawn. In fact there was a number of mistakes, a number of sections that were not included and because of this problem the committee reintroduced another bill, LB 535, which made the corrections that were the way that 163 was originally supposed to be drawn. So what has happened in this situation is this. In order to not confuse this thing and have two bills that are similar, the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee is asking for the withdrawal of 163 since 535 is a bill that replaces it. It is properly drawn. This would save the taxpayers some money by not having the bills printed and not having to have a hearing on it and so forth. So if we could, we would like to withdraw LB 163. Thank you.
