SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you, Senator Kremer.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I move the previous question.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Debate ceases. Senator Lamb, you may close on your motion to amend.

SENATOR LAMB: I have no close.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: All right, the motion before the house is the adoption of the Lamb amendment on the Cullan motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 11 nays on the motion to amend, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Motion fails. Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I renew my other motion for the previous question.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: All right, do I see five hands? This is on the main question. All those in favor of ceasing debate then and proceeding with the vote on the other question will vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, obviously there are not sufficient votes in the room this morning to rerefer these bills. I would like to say that there is concern in the body about how bills are referred and I think generally the Executive Board has done a very good job. I am concerned about the divergence of
