LB 15, 135

CLERK: Mr. President, the Education Committee gives notice of cancellation of public hearings for Monday, February 5. That is signed by Senator Koch. Senator Hasebroock offers a rules suspension to suspend Rule 3, Section 5, so as to allow for the cancellation of the hearing for LB's 15 and 135.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Senator Hasebroock, any further statement on the motion to suspend.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, just that these bills are more germane to the Retirement Committee and through the good graces of the chairman of Education he has reset the hearings on these bills and has agreed to let them come over to Retirement and I move that the rules be suspended and this be made possible.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: So this will be necessary to suspend the rules to make this change. Any further discussion? All those then in favor of suspending the rules to allow this change in the assignment of these bills vote aye, opposed nay. It will require 30 votes. Have you all voted? We are voting on the suspension of the rules to allow the assignment of bills to the Retirement Committee and to cancel hearings for the Education Committee. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the rules suspension, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Motion passes. The rules are suspended. The hearings are therefore cancelled. We will proceed then with agenda item #5, introduction of new bills beginning with Request #775, Agriculture Committee. Senator Schmit is not here so we will call on Senator Lamb, I believe is vice chairman. Is that right, Senator Lamb? The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, I have a bill here that I haven't seen before and I am certain it is meritorious and I would recommend that it be introduced.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: That sounds like an enthusiastic support. Is there any discussion? The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, may I ask Senator Lamb a simple question please?

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Senator Lamb, will you answer a simple question?
