PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel for purposes of a motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you got the motion there, Pat?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Marvel moves to suspend Rule 6, Sec. 6b so as to take up Final Reading today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, I so move.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion on the Speaker's motion to suspend the rules so that LB 9 may be taken up for Final Reading today. If not, all those in favor of suspending the rules for that purpose vote aye, opposed nay. This will require 30 votes. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay on the motion to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried. The rules are suspended. We are then ready for agenda item #5, Final Reading. The Sergeant at Arms will make certain that all nonlegislative persons are off the floor of the Legislature. All legislators return to their desks. We are on Final Reading, and as soon as everyone is at his or her desk, we shall commence with the reading of LB 9. We are ready then, Mr. Clerk. Proceed then with the reading, Final Reading, of LB 9.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read LB 9 on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 9 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Has everybody voted? Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read record vote. (See page 507, Legislative Journal.) The vote is 33 ayes, 8 nays, 2 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 9 passes. We will proceed then to agenda item...that will conclude Final Reading for today...we will proceed then with agenda item #7, General File or special
