PRESIDENT: Motion carries. LB 85 is advanced to E & R Initial. The Clerk will have some matters to be read.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Government, Military and Veterans Affairs, whose Chairman is Senator Keyes, to whom we referred Legislative Bill 122, instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be indefinitely postponed. 139 indefinitely postponed. 147 indefinitely postponed. 155 indefinitely postponed, and 156 indefinitely postponed. Signed, Senator Keyes, Chairman.

Mr. President, your Committee on Ag and Environment gives notice of public hearing in Room 1520 for February 22. (See Page 520 of the Legislative Journal.) And your committee on Retirement gives notice of public hearing in Room 2102 for February 20, and that's signed by Senator Hasebroock, Chairman. (See Page 521 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: I see then we're back on General File to LB 115. Mr. Clerk, you will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, Legislative Bill 115...(Read by title LB 115). The bill was first read on January 8th of this year. It was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, after such a very good job of meeting the needs of the people of this state, which is to cut down legislation, we have another bill before us now that has two committee amendments, and I would like to accept the one committee amendment that just puts on the emergency clause. We'll split it in two if it's alright with everybody, and we will accept...try to accept the one that makes the...puts the emergency clause on it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: This is a divided...Senator Keyes has asked us to divide the question. It actually...the committee amendments contain two matters. If there are no objections, we can vote on the emergency clause. Is that the first portion of the amendment?

SENATOR KEYES: That's the last portion of the amendment. It's adding a new section.
