SENATOR KEYES: That's the one that we added a new section.

PRESIDENT: All right, we will take up the last one first. Is there any discussion? We are dividing the question... Senator Kahle. Have we sufficiently confused you now so you are...

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker, I...as I look at this bill, I wonder what we're really trying to do now in the county that I come from we do not have a full time surveyor, and it might be difficult to elect someone from another county to serve in a county as a part time surveyor. Could Senator Haberman, or someone explain to me what we're really trying to do?

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes...Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: My good friend, this amendment that we are talking on now just adds the emergency clause, which we'll get through with that, and then we'll start in on the bill if it's all right with you and the others.

PRESIDENT: He wants you to put it into effect immediately before you find out what it does.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, which seems very practical.

PRESIDENT: Let's take care of the immediacy first.

SENATOR KAHLE: Sounds reasonable to me.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the second portion of the amendment which is to add the emergency clause? All those in favor of that part of the committee amendment adding the emergency clause vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the emergency clause, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The emergency clause is added. That part of the amendment is adopted. Senator Keyes, would you address yourself to the first part of the amendment then?

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Mr. Speaker, and fellow senators, I am going to be very candid about this. I didn't realize that there are counties...some fifty that do not have enough population, do not have enough income to hire a surveyor, do not have a qualified surveyor within their county, and so they appoint one or hire one from without.
