PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Debate ceases. Senator Merz, you may close on your motion.

SENATOR MERZ: I don't think we need a close.

PRESIDENT: The question then is the adoption of the Merz amendment to LB 26. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Merz, do you want to do anything about it?

SENATOR MERZ: How many is missing? Nine. How many is missing that aren't absent?

PRESIDENT: Several have gone since we took that count.

SENATOR MERZ: Maybe we just as well have a Call of the House and get them back. Let it go.

PRESIDENT: All right. Record the vote.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Merz' amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. We now have...Mr. Speaker, do you want to attempt to move the bill? Senator Kremer, do you wish to attempt to move the bill? Do you want to carry it over? There are several people who wish to speak on the bill itself. Senator Kelly, do you still want to speak of the bill? All right, and Senator Schmit has got his light on. Senator Cullan probably wants to speak again. Speaker Marvel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: With that in mind, I will move, well, go ahead and read what you have got there.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk has some matters to read in.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Judiciary whose Chairman is Senator Nichol to whom was referred LB 524 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments; LB 449 indefinitely postponed; LB 450 indefinitely postponed; LB 451 and 518 indefinitely postponed. Signed, Senator Nichol, Chairman.
