I think Judge Urbom mentioned that in a situation like this where a girl is going to get an abortion without talking to her parents, to run her to them is going to exacerbate the situation. They cannot talk, that is obvious. To have a provision as exists in the law now is one of the cruelest, most insensitive pieces of legislation that could disgrace this Legislature and I think to compel a girl to go through this after the indignities and the trauma that she has suffered already is unconscionable.
