SENATOR SIMON: Just a question of the Speaker if he will yield as far as further expansion.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Marvel, will you respond?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir.

SENATOR SIMON: Senator Marvel, you mentioned some instances in terms of where the introducer would be taken care of. Now if I understand your suggestion, like for example, you did not mention so I want this clear for the record, like for an example if I had a meeting in my district or I am at a national meeting, something like this, what you are saying is that the introducer of the bill is not here, nothing will be taken up. Is that correct? I want to pin you down on that because there is a couple of instances if I have a meeting in my district or even if I am out researching something which I don't do, but even if I was...

SPEAKER MARVEL: All I can do, Senator Simon, is to attempt to appeal finally to the good will of the members of the body. So what I am saying in effect is that if the introducer is absent, I will assume it is for a good reason and therefore the bill would be passed over.

SENATOR SIMON: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, I would just like to speak to the ruling by Speaker Marvel. I support him very strongly in this effort and I rise in support because specifically LB 305 is one example of the problem that we have here. Both on General File and now on Select File there is an amendment by Senator George which he is going to attempt to change entirely the intent of the bill and I have no objection to attempting to amend the legislation but it delays the process. It encourages waste of time and I
