PRESIDENT: Motion the Call be raised. If there isn't any objection, the Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to refer to committee.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. LR 22 is referred to a committee to be designated by the Executive Board as Reference Committee. That will conclude then the motions under agenda item #6. We will then proceed to agenda item #8, General File, and Mr. Clerk, you certainly may read some things in at this time.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports we have carefully examined and reviewed LB 87 and find the same...and recommend that same be placed on Select File with amendments; LB 146 is reported as correctly engrossed; LB 316 correctly engrossed and that is signed by Senator Wesely, Chairman.

Mr. President, your committee on Revenue whose Chairman is Senator Carsten to whom was referred LB 360 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be indefinitely postponed and LB 528 indefinitely postponed. Signed Senator Carsten, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: We will now proceed then with General File, LB 359. Mr. Clerk, if you will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 359. Title read. The bill was read for the first time on January 16. It was referred to the Agriculture and Environment Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. The body considered the bill on March 6th of 1979. I do have amendments pending, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Speaker advises me there is speaking order on this. We will complete the speaking order that the Speaker has given me and then we will proceed. There is a motion on the desk but we will complete the speaking order. Senator Schmit and Senator Haberman have been designated to speak at which time we will take up a motion on the desk.
