I hope each one of you will support the concerns of our Governor as he tries to move with our help or our hindrance along the path that Nebraska is moving today. Thank you for your attention, and please vote to support LB 500 as it moves from General File to Enrollment and Review.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of the bill to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.
