LB 57, 102, 375

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on Page 1185 of the Legislative Journal.) 35 ayes, 1 nay, 11 excused and not voting, and 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.)

PRESIDENT: LB 375 passes on Final Reading. Before we take up LB 57, the Chair would like to introduce also from Senator Koch's district some 52 fourth grade students from Swanson Elementary School in Omaha, 3 teachers and 4 parents, Shawn Hes' n, teacher. They're in the south balcony. Would they wave to us from Swanson Elementary School? Good morning to you. Welcome to the Legislature. Okay, the Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 57.

CLERK: (Read LB 57.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 57 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote on this.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on Page 1186 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 11 nays, 11 excused and not voting, and 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 57 fails on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 102. The Chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President and members of the Unicameral Legislature, in my bill book on LB 102 there is an amendment on the front of that bill, and I don't...I've never seen that before. I don't know what the situation is.

PRESIDENT: I think that's a good question. Mr. Clerk, would you attempt to answer that question?

CLERK: Senator, I think it was just simply placed on your wrong bill. It should be on your green copy of the bill book. The amendment that you find in your Final Reading book was adopted by the body I believe on March 21. It should be found in your green copy. That amendment has been incorporated in the Final Reading copy, as I understand it.

PRESIDENT: In other words, it should be incorporated in that Final Reading copy of 102. That amendment should be incorporated in it. If there's any further question, why I...yes, alright. Does that answer your question, Senator Kelly?
