SPEAKER MARVEL: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I am about to sign and do sign LB 19, 112, 240, 375, 102, 125, 377, 26, 137, 201, 204, 205, 213, 255, 265, 288, 292, 476, 477, 509, 545, 551. First bill up, on the last page of the present consent calendar LB 136. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 136 was introduced by Senator Myron Rumery. Title read. The bill was read on January 9. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator George's Urban Affairs Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The committee amendments simply tighten down the provision which originally was in the bill that would provide to go as far as one mile out. Right now the committee amendment simply says adjoining such city street which divides the city corporate area and area adjoining that city. In other words, it is simply a restriction to the immediate area which is necessary in order to be able to fund the construction of that particular street. I move the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 136. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the committee amendments to 136.
