SPEAKER MARVEL: Are we...where are we, Mr. Clerk? Senator Nichol, do you want to explain your amendment?

SENATOR NICHOL: I've already explained one. Do we take all three of them, Pat, at once?

CLERK: We can't do that, Senator.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay. I have explained the one and I move for the adoption of that changing the effective date... operative date.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are two Nichol amendments. This is the adoption of the first Nichol amendment to LB 14 on Select File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the first Nichol amendment to LB 14. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? We're voting on the first Nichol amendment to LB 14. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Nichol's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The first amendment's adopted. Now we'll go to the second amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nichol now moves to amend LB 14 as follows: (Read second Nichol amendment as found on Page 1350 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR NICHOL: That's the one we just voted on.

CLERK: Well, now...the one we just voted on was the one on the white sheets that you gave us.

SENATOR NICHOL: Oh. Well, do you want me to explain that one then? Mr. Chairman, that one was the one that we just voted on, and the explanation of that is, that it's a technical measure whereby the money can go from the general fund to the cash fund, and then from the cash fund to the agency. I guess that's the one we voted on.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, what's the second one then? Alright, the Clerk will read again the second amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President the amendment now before us in on Page 2 of the Standing Committee amendments, line 16, strike

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
