So I move we indefinitely postpone the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the indefinite postponement of LB 187. Okay, read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Keyes moves to return LB 187 to Select File for specific amendment, the amendment being to strike the enacting clause.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 26 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Clerk, do you have some items to read in?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, I have four Attorney General opinions, one addressed to Senator George regarding LB 176; one to Senator Johnson regarding LB 285; a second to Senator Johnson regarding LB 285; and a fourth to Senator Carsten regarding LB 285. (See pages 1369-1375, Journal.)

Mr. President, Senator Koch makes a motion to reconsider the body's action on Final passage of LB 58.

Mr. President, your committee on Revenue whose Chairman is Senator Hasebroock, Committee on Retirement Systems, whose Chairman is Senator Hasebroock to whom was referred LB 283 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments.

New bills, LB 382A. Title read. LB 172A. Title read. LB 576A. Title read.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes, your light is on, for what purpose do you ask...

SENATOR KEYES: Just while we are reading this bill, I would like to know, how many have to be on the floor at all times to make a quorum so that we can read it or do we have to have a certain number on the floor?
