I think it's only fair that we put a sunset provision on the increase so that those with the strong lobbying efforts have to come back year by year and justify as we get up here in the twelve...twelve and a half percent interest rates. I wholeheartedly and really beg of this Legislature to pass this amendment, to put a sunset provision on this so that some of us can possibly go along with this thing for a temporary period and not saddle the people with a usury rate that's so high it's not really giving them any help in the State of Nebraska, and permanently saddle them with such a high usury rate. Thank you.
