LB 136

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this bill has become quite a concern to some of the cities and towns throughout the state and they would prefer that it be enacted immediately instead of waiting ninety days after the Legislature adjourns. Therefore, I move the return to Select File for this specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion on Senator Rumery's motion to return for the purpose of adding the emergency clause to LB 136? Seeing none, I guess, Senator Rumery, that will constitute your opening and your close. All those in favor of returning LB 136 vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The bill is returned. Senator Rumery, would you care to move the amendment?

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The addition of the emergency clause?

SENATOR RUMERY: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? If not, all those in favor of adopting the amendment to the bill to add the emergency clause vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on the motion on the adoption of Senator Rumery's amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Senator Rumery, what do you wish to do with the bill?

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the bill be advanced to Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: Motion to advance LB 136 to E & R for engrossment. Any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying aye, opposed nay. LB 136 is advanced to E & R for engrossment. Next bill then on Final Reading will then be LB 143.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.
