CLERK: 26 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Senator DeCamp. What do you want to do?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I would ask unanimous consent, I think I am doing what we talked about. LB 222 was set for today. Senator Marvel and some others have requested we don't take it up today. He will set another date.
