LB 594, 585

It is my understanding that we are going to advance these bills to Select File at which place they will gather and we will proceed from there. Is that correct? Okay, the Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that LB 594 be advanced. In addition, Mr. President, I might add that some of the points that have been discussed that we are putting together some information which will be distributed to the members, the collective fiscal impact of the various bills, and they will have time to look that over before the bills come up on Select File and then react accordingly as far as any amendments that might be offered. So I think that will probably expedite their consideration. So I move the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Mr. Clerk, do you wish to read?

CLERK: I think I should, Senator. Mr. President, LB 594. Read title. The bill was first read on April 6. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee. It was considered on April 11. At that time it failed to advance. An amendment by Senator Warner was adopted. I now have an amendment by Senator Koch. You have an amendment...Select File, Senator. Okay.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance LB 594 to E & R for engrossment, E & R for review, to E & R. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. The motion is advancement of the bill. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The Clerk will read LB 585.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 585. Title read. The bill was read on March 30. It was referred directly to General File. I now have amendments by Senator Warner but I understand he wishes to withdraw those. Senator Keyes has amendments but he wishes to withdraw those.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Mr. President, my amendment is to be withdrawn. I have a rewritten one I will submit on Select File. So I move the bill be...Senator Keyes withdrew his for Select File. I will move LB 585 be advanced. This is the bill, if you will recall, that has all of the aid funds for local subdivisions or individuals, other agencies, the last section in the green book.
