So it is the same procedure, and I would move that the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you move the advancement of the bill to E & R for Review?

SENATOR WARNER: I should still point out that it would still require an appropriation process to the Legislature just as it does now.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 590 to E & R for Review. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Now will you get LB 579, which is Senator Maresh's claims bill? He'd like to advance that now rather than wait for a couple of claims that will come a little bit later. Go ahead.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 579 was introduced by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read title to LB 579.) The bill was read on March 7. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Maresh, do you want to make a motion that we adopt the committee amendments?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Mr. Speaker, I move that the committee amendments be adopted. They are...in the bill book you will find one for \$68,455.10 to Boone County. It was an error by the Assessor there and the committee decided to adopt that. We have one for \$10,708 by Major Robert J. VanValkenburg in attorney fees, and then we have one for the Nebraska Press Advertising Service for printing the ballots for the amendments, which is \$262,152.79. Then there are some clarifying amendments. Are those printed in the Journal, Mr. Clerk? Those that I handed in the other day?

CLERK: Which ones? Well yes, but we have to deal with them separately, Senator.

SENATOR MARESH: Okay, very good.
