All those in favor of the Call of the House vote aye, opposed no. Shall the House go under Call? Shall the House go under Call? Have you all voted? The motion is a Call of the House. Shall the House go under Call? Record. Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 18 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats. Record your presence. Please record your presence so we can proceed with the roll call and complete this amendment, and one other one on 587. Senator Sieck. Senator Schmit. Senator Goodrich. Senator Duis. Senator Keyes, do you want to proceed with the roll call vote?

SENATOR KEYES: I think so. It just takes 25.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Clerk call the roll. We're calling the roll on the Keyes' amendment to 587.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on Pages 1784 and 1785 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost.

CLERK: I have one final motion, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will read the final motion.

CLERK: Senator Maresh moves to amend the bill, LB 587. (Read Maresh amendment as found on Page 1785 of the Legislative Journal.) That's by Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this pertains to the Medical Center. This is to reduce the general fund by 85,000 and increase the cash revolving fund by the same amount. This would give legislative intent that the tuition should be increased at the Medical Center. Presently Kansas, our neighbor to the south, is charging \$3,000 per year for four quarters, where our Medical Center is charging only \$1800 for the coming year, which is only sixty percent of the Kansas rate, and I think that's bad for the State of Nebraska to have to subsidize the medical students and then fifty percent leave the State of Nebraska. I move that the amendment be adopted.
