SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The A bill is advanced, 444A. Do you have anything to read into the record?

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined and reviewed LB 387 and recommend that same be replaced on Select File. Senator Dworak offers explanation of vote. That's all I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The next bill is LB 11. The Chair recognizes Senator Reutzel. I'm sorry, Mr. Clerk, and then Senator Reutzel.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 11.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 11.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried.
