CLERK: (Roll call vote taken which may be found on Pages 1952 and 1953 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move that LB 398 be readvanced to E & R for Engrossment, and ask for a machine vote.

PRESIDENT: You asked for a machine vote? Alright, the motion to advance...readvance to E & R for Engrossment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The House is under Call so that isn't going to help anybody.
