We will try to keep them off as long as we can till the 15th but you can let us do our preliminary work and recommendations if you will do that tomorrow or Monday.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have any other business on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 262 and recommend that same be placed on Select File with amendments; 363, 363A, and 398 replaced on Select File.
