SENATOR NEWELL: Senator Warner, one last question. Do you think there would be any benefit for the Appropriations Committee to look into this proposal, to look into just exactly what has happened because of these decisions and you know do a study basically? I have not offered interim study resolution but I happen to have one here on my desk which might be a good substitute for this proposal. Do you think that the Appropriations could....the Appropriations Committee could find some time to look into this to find out if there is great inequities?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Time is up.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes. You don't need the resolution. I think that we will be reviewing those issues in any event.

SENATOR NEWELL: With that Mr. President, I would like to save the body some time and withdraw the resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You ask unanimous consent to withdraw the resolution?

SENATOR NEWELL: I do.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any objection? If not, so ordered. We will now proceed with Final Reading. All legislators please take their seats. We have....take your seats. We have two hours of Final Reading which is on the schedule today. The Clerk will read LB 358 on Final Reading. All legislators please take your seats. Okay, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read LB 358.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 10 nays, 5 excused and not voting, 4 present and not voting. Vote appears on page 2220 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed. The Clerk will read on Final Reading LB 484.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Read the motion.
