LB 484, 495, 99

SENATOR SIECK: Okay, real fine.

SPEAKER MARVEL: No further discussion, the motion is to return 484 to Select File. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, no nays on the motion to return Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The bill has been moved to Select File. Next bill on Final Reading LB 495.

CLERK: Read LB 495.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 10 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting. Vote appears on pages 2220-2221 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried with the emergency clause attached. Clerk will now read on Final Reading LB 99.

CLERK: Read LB 99.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? I would alert the members of the Legislature to the fact that if this goes on the primary ballot it needs forty votes. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: 41 ayes, 6 nays, 2 excused and not voting. Vote appears on page 2224 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Bill is declared passed. Before we go to the next bill on Final Reading in the north balcony we have some visitors from the State of Kansas. 36 seventh graders, four teachers and two parents from St. Peter Paul Elementary School Seneca, Kansas. Mrs. Joan Busser is the teacher. Will you raise your hands so we can see where you all are. Good afternoon. In case you are confused about the operation, the Nebraska Constitution demands that every bill that is finally passed must be read in full. That is what we are doing now, and there has been an attempt to change this at
