PRESIDENT: So it is on the sheet...all right, record the vote then.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 2283 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 16 nays, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 152 passes on Final Reading. Yes, you certainly may, Mr. Clerk, wants to read some things in before we proceed.

CLERK: Mr. President, first of all, your committee on Revenue whose chairman is Senator Carsten to whom is referred LB 71 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments.

Your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined LB 11 and find the same correctly enrolled; 42 correctly enrolled; 86 correctly enrolled.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of doing business I propose to sign and I do sign LB 11, LB 42, LB 86. The Chair would also like to take this opportunity to introduce in behalf of Senator Cope, his brother, Jim Cope, from Wickenburg, Arizona, and his sister, Betty Ayres, from Lincoln. They are seated under the North balcony and would they stand and be recognized? Welcome to the Nebraska Legislature. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading, LB 158.
