SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman, do you want to close on your motion?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. Chairman, fellow legislators, a terrible picture has been painted, and I would like to call to the attention of this body that the ADC payments have increased 27% in the last two years. I will say that possibly they are too low but Senator DeCamp 27% isn't too shabby in a two year period. There are some problems for example the aged, the blind and the disabled one person gets \$295 a month base, that is where it starts out. Then you go over to the Aid to Dependent Children, two people they get \$250 a month. So if you go ahead and tie all of this the 295 and the 250 to the supplemental security income that will solve the problem according to the information that I have. I told you that the people who are to conduct the study say that the magnitude of this is overwhelming. All right so say that \$250,000 isn't too much money. But what about the 5 million in 81 and 82? All I can say is I think we ought to be careful, go easy, and take another look. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to read the motion.
