Call. All legislators are to be at their desks.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Let it go, Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman, what? You don't want a roll call vote?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I will lift the roll call vote. Let's have a record vote though. Let's have a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: All right, what do you want?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: All right, he is back to the roll call vote. Go ahead, roll call vote. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If a person can't even decide what kind of vote he wants how can he decide an important issue like this resolution?

PRESIDENT: Let's have a roll call vote and we will be done with it.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 355 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and LR 30 is advanced and is being treated as a bill, as I say, under the rules. A motion to raise the Call, Senator Kelly. The Call is raised. Speaker Marvel, do you want to take up anything? We have some things to read in and then I will call on the Speaker.

CLERK: Mr. President, Attorney General's opinions, one addressed to Senator Wesely and one addressed to Senator Cullan. Both will be inserted in the Legislative Journal. (See pages 355-357.)

Mr. President, your committee on Nebraska Retirement Systems gives notice of public hearing in Hearing Room 1520 for Tuesday, January 29. That is signed by Senator Fowler as Chairman.

Mr. President, your committee on education whose chairman is Senator Koch to whom is referred LB 734 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; 735 advanced to General File, (signed) Senator Koch, Chairman.
