SPEAKER MARVEL: The amendment is adopted. Now we are ready to advance the bill. Senator Fitzgerald, do you move to advance the bill? It is the A bill?

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. We will now return to item 7, a specific amendment on LB 442. Senator Beutler.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler's amendment is found on page 517 of the Legislative Journal, and it is a motion to return to Select File for that specific amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam Speaker and members of the Legislature, to refresh your memory a bit, this bill, 442, has to do with the probationary period in technical community colleges, and you may recall that it was argued on the floor last time around, that right now there was no probationary period, that perhaps the college would like to see something like four or five years, but that it was compromised at two years. A probationary period of two years is what the bill provides for right now. And you may also recall that I tried to amend that up, that the Education Committee had recommended a longer probationary period, three years plus one, but the Education
