SENATOR WARNER: A point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir. State your point.

SENATOR WARNER: I just wanted to express my appreciation to Senator Reutzel for now recognizing the importance of Final Reading and I certainly admire his turn around in position, so, thank you.

PRESIDENT: And I would hope that we would have...will that constitute all the speeches at this time? If so, now that we are all in our seats and all paying attention why, we will now have on Final Reading, LB 413. Proceed to read, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 413 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 413 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on pages 556-557 of the Journal.) 45 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting and 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 413 passes. Senator Venditte.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, as a matter of information to the Chair, on LB 413, of the 45 members that were voting only 10 senators were following the course of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. I think that should be noted for posterity. We will proceed. The Clerk will read a few matters in.

CLERK: Mr. President, briefly, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined and engrossed LB 221 and find the same correctly engrossed, 306 correctly engrossed, 442 correctly engrossed, 496 correctly engrossed, 526 correctly engrossed, 598 correctly engrossed, (Signed) Senator Wesely, Chairman.

Mr. President, a new resolution, LR 195 offered by Senator Beutler. (Read LR 195 as found on pages 557-558 of the Legislative Journal.) That, Mr. President, will be referred to the Executive Board.

PRESIDENT: All right, we are ready for Special Order then. The Chair understands that agenda item #8, Special Order,
