SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, that I support the Dworak amendment and ask that you vote to adopt it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak, do you have anything in closing?

SENATOR DWORAK: Waive closing.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Dworak amendment to the Schmit amendment to 319. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. 25 votes. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Dworak amendment is adopted.

CLERK: We are now on the amended Schmit amendment, Mr. President, Request #2036.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion now is on the amended Schmit amendment. Senator Marsh, your light is on. Do you wish to speak to the amendment?

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, sir, I do. I have some questions I would like to pose for Senator Schmit.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Schmit, on page 3 as your amendment now reads, is it your intent to have all state printing go through the Department of Corrections?

SENATOR SCHMIT: No, that is not my intent.

SENATOR MARSH: Is the language as it now reads...since the language is as it now reads, how would a state agency determine what printing would go to Corrections and what printing would go to DAS with no agency in charge of that? Do they all run to the Governor's office to find out?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I think, Senator Marsh, that that would be worked out administratively and I do not think it would be a problem.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, a question of Senator Schmit, please.

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
