SPEAKER MARVEL: Committee amendments? Senator Hefner, can you take the committee amendments to 742?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Chairman and members of the body, I believe this is a technical amendment. Let me look.... yes, Mr. President and members of the body, the committee amendment is just a technical amendment that changes the terminology from "assessed" to "assessments" and "valued" to "valuation". That is all this amendment does. I urge the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any further discussion on the committee amendment? All in favor of the adoption of the committee amendments to 742 vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the committee amendments to LB 742. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the adoption of the committee amendments to 742? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 742 was brought to us and requested of us to introduce on behalf of the Department of Revenue with the explanation that in their opinion the revaluation of property every year was not being successful, that there were many that were not able to do a good job in doing that and that in reality it was overlapping more than that one year as had been required of them. In the opinion of the Department of Revenue, every two years seemed to be acceptable and one that they could get their job done and do it with a good degree of accuracy as opposed to inadequate annual revaluations or updates. It is in that light that we accepted the bill to introduce and the committee believes that it will do just that, that there will be a better job done by the local level. With that, Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 742 as amended.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of the advancement of the bill vote aye, opposed vote no. We are advancing 742 as amended. The motion is the advancement of 742 as explained by Senator Carsten. Have you all voted? Record the vote.
