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there then be replacement housing provided elsewhere in the community as part of the redevelopment plan. So the intent of these amendments is to try and limit somewhat the scope of this by striking the shopping malls and plazas, by indicating it has to be public parking, by tightening down the federal act we referred to and hopefully prevent some abuses to people that may be living in the areas that are going to be redeveloped and assist them in relocation, and also assist the community in finding replacement housing. As one of the fish being pushed to back this bill, I would move for adoption of these amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Fowler amendments as explained. Senator George, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you, Mr. President, just as a brief explanation, we fully agree with the amendments as presented by Senator Fowler. I don't think that the last one is absolutely necessary because section 18-2103.02, Urban Renewal and Community Development Housing, does provide for relocation of people that might be affected by that redevelopment area, but if Senator Fowler feels that that should be further clarified that is all right with me. His first amendment does take out the objection that the Attorney General had and Senator Murphy had, and I think if parking facilities are built it most certainly should be clear that if tax increment financing monies are used for that they most certainly should be public. So I fully support Senator Fowler's amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Senator Fowler, a question, if I may. You did eliminate some of the provisions as to what they can do with it but you noticeably left in "skywalk". Was that intentional?

SENATOR FOWLER: Yes, I have a soft spot for "skywalk", Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: That would be the skywalk to the First National Bank. True?

SENATOR FOWLER: We don't pass legislation for a specific project. We pass legislation for the whole state so it could be skywalks spanning the state, I would think, Senator Murphy.
