SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, I move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch, I think we are down to the close by Senator George anyway, so thank you. Senator George, you may close.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you, Mr. President. I think we have last Thursday debated these issues. I didn't expect to change Senator Murphy's mind in that. I can, in a way, understand his philosophy but the projects have to be done. I think this is a good vehicle to do it and since we have most members that were absent on Thursday back here, I think we can just go ahead now and vote. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The motion then is the motion to advance LB 986. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? We are voting on the motion to advance LB 986.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I believe there are not enough members on the floor and I think I have to ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Shall the House go under Call? Record the vote.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will see that all legislators return to the chamber. All members will return to their desks. All members will register their presence. All unauthorized personnel leave the floor. The House is under Call. Let's try to get back and with it as soon as we can so we can get into some other matters this morning. There are ten absent, Senator George, just so you would know. At the present time there are ten excused, those that have not arrived that have been temporarily excused. So there are ten absent.

SENATOR GEORGE: We are waiting for four more people.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz is coming in so now there are nine. Senator George, will you take call ins? Do you want to take call ins?

SENATOR GEORGE: No, I think I would like to have a roll call vote.
